Sticky Knowledge

I know that some things happened a very long time ago, before I was born.
I know that the Great Fire lasted for 4 days.
I know that houses a long time ago were made from wood.
I know that water buckets a long time ago were made from leather.
I know that houses now are made from brick.
I understand that wood catches fire easily and spreads quickly and brick doesn't.
I know that we have fire engines now, but a long time ago we didn't.
I know that fire is made up of red, orange and yellow colours.
I can re-enact what it was like a long time ago, passing buckets of water, filling up buckets of water, putting out the fire, rowing on the river, running to safety.
I understand how to follow directions in PE to get different places from the Great Fire for example to the bakery, to the river, to the Kings house.

Key Vocab

Bakery	A place that makes bread, cakes etc
Baking	To cook using dry heat at a medium oven temperature - bread, cakes, pies are baked
Diary	A daily record of a persons' experiences and thoughts
Fire	The heat, light and flames produced by burning
Spread	Quickly / Slowly As soon as you can, speedy Not moving quickly, taking a long time
Sunday	Last day of the week
September	9 th month of the year
Leather / Wood / Brick	Material made from the skin of an animal The hard material lying under the bark that makes up the trunk and branches of a tree
Buildings	A large structure for people to live or do things in e.g. school, work
Fire Hook	A pole with a hooked metal head for tearing down walls or ceilings
Key Figures	Main / Most important people

Key Facts

The fire started on Sunday 2 nd September (a very long time ago) in Thomas Farriners Bakery on Pudding Lane
The fire / oven in the Bakery had not been put out properly
The fire spread quickly. All of the buildings and houses were made out of straw and wood, and they were very close together.
The local people tried to put out the fire using leather buckets, but they were not successful. King Charles II order for the buildings to be pulled down using fire hooks.
On Thursday 6 th September the last of the flames were put out.
